adventure hideo ashida is a police chemist and the only japanese on the l a cop payroll the investigation throws them together and rips them apart the crime becomes a political storm centre that brilliantly illuminates these four driven souls âe comrades rivals lovers historyâe tm s pawns perfidia is a novel of astonishments it is world war ii as you have never seen it and los angeles as james ellroy has never written it before here he gives us the party at the edge of the abyss and the precipice of americaâe tm s ascendance perfidia is that moment spellbindingly captured it beckons us to solve a great crime that in its turn explicates the crime of war itself it is a great american novel sunday times bestseller book of the week on radio 4 a beautiful book about a part of the modern world which remains genuinely magical mark haddon one of the most constantly fascinating but consistently under appreciated aspects of modern life is the business of flying mark vanhoenacker has written the ideal book on the subject a description of what it s like to fly by a commercial pilot who is also a master prose stylist and a deeply sensitive human being this is a man who is at and the poetry of physics to the names of winds and the nature of clouds here anew is the simple wonder that remains at the heart of an experience which modern travellers armchair and otherwise all too easily take for granted the transcendent joy of motion and the remarkable new perspectives that height and distance bestow on everything we love a beautiful contemplative book what skyfaring gives is something we need elevation another perspective normally when i find a volume where prose style and subject matter fuse so pleasingly i tear through it

in a day here i found myself pausing on almost every page as i absorbed its detail or phrasing nicholas lezard guardian a 2015 book of the year the economist the new york times gq and more presents an analysis of social media discussing how a technology which was once heralded as democratic has evolved into one which promotes elitism and inequality and provides companies with the means of invading privacy in search of profits walter kirn should be sentenced to a lifetime writing fiction proclaimed the new york times book review about his short story collection my hard bargain the christian science monitor praised his engaging blend of deadpan humor and genuine empathy thankfully said the philadelphia inquirer kirn never abandons his theme of uncertainty when observing modern angst now walter kirn has fashioned she needed me a moving surprising and darkly comic novel whose sympathetic portrait of a disillusioned generation is mercifully uncynical weaver walquist and kim lindgren first meet outside a st paul minnesota abortion clinic kim twenty three pregnant with no money to finish junior college is about to walk inside weaver is lying in front of the door at twenty six he is a bible carrying member of the conscience squad a fanatical right wing protest group yet readers of all minds will be drawn to this gentle questing soul as he struggles with his feelings for kim and his subsequent sexual desire for her his crumbling devotion to the church and his waning loyalty to his employer sanipure a christian soap and cosmetics company that calls sales fellowship moments but weaver was not always devout the only child of a widowed highly successful wisconsin liquor store owner he tried to ward off teenage isolation with a mixture of pot and pills vodka sex and heavy metal music until born again christian lucas boone found him half dead on the floor of a greyhound station men s room as weaver tries to persuade kim to have her baby they embark upon a journey that brings them into contact with a cast of keenly drawn characters chuck and dixie lindgren kim s parents who made more money in one hot las vegas weekend than they ever earned from their north dakota farm charismatic paranoid lucas boone popping anti depressant pills like candy kim s disaffected brother ricky who makes a modest living burglarizing his relatives homes and finally sharp tongued margaret walquist whom weaver always thinks of as my mother the businesswoman a funny bittersweet chronicle of young people falling in love and searching for answers in a crazy changing world she needed me is vibrant and honest without being judgmental walter kirn whose stories evoked the feeling that life s simple and that it s also too complex to even begin to understand rick bass the dallas morning news has triumphed again with a novel that aims for the human heart and strikes its mark throughout erica heller s life when people learned that joseph heller was her father they often remarked how terrific but was there a catch like his most famous work her father was a study in contradictions eccentric brilliant and voracious but also mercurial competitive and stubborn with a love of mischief that sometimes cut too close to the bone being raised by such a larger than life personality could be claustrophobic even at the sprawling upper west side apartments of the apthorp which the hellers called home in one way or another for forty five years yossarian slept here is erica heller s wickedly funny but also poignant and incisive memoir about growing up in a family her iconic father her wry beautiful mother shirley her younger brother ted her relentlessly inventive grandmother dottie that could be by turns caring infuriating and exasperating though anything but dull from the forbidden pleasures of ordering shrimp cocktail when it was beyond the family s budget to spending a summer as her father s fame grew at the beverly hills hotel erica details the hellers charmed and charmingly turbulent trajectory she offers a rare glimpse of meetings with the gourmet club where her father would dine weekly with mel brooks zero mostel and mario puzo among others and from which all wives and children were strictly verboten she introduces us to many extraordinary residents of the apthorp some famous george balanchine sidney poitier and lena horne to name a few and some not famous but all quite memorable yet she also manages to limn the complex bonds of loyalty and guilt hurt and healing that define every family erica was among those present at her father s bedside as he struggled to recover from guillain barré syndrome and then cared for her mother when shirley was diagnosed with terminal cancer after the thirty eight year marriage and intensely passionate partnership with joe had ended witty and perceptive and displaying the descriptive gifts of a born storyteller this authentic and colorful portrait of life in the heller household unfolds alongside the saga of the family s moves into four distinctive apartments within the apthorp each representing a different phase of their lives together and apart it is a story about achieving a dream about fame and its aftermath about lasting love squandered opportunities and how to have the best meal in chinatown a vigorous tough novel that dramatizes so well the awful power of family by the new york times bestselling author of the whites and cloggers the atlantic monthly eighteen year old stony de coco has to make a choice either join his father in the tightly knit world of new york s construction unions or take off and find his own path but stony s family is not about to make that choice easy as he struggles to protect his little brother albert from their dangerously unbalanced mother and to postpone the difficult adult responsibilities that await him he finds hope in a job working with children at a hospital a job that promises not to make anyone happy but stony for all of the road to healing squirrel hill pittsburgh is one of the oldest jewish neighborhoods in the country known for its tight knit community and the profusion of multigenerational families on october 27 2018 a gunman killed eleven jews who were worshipping at the tree of life synagogue in squirrel hill the most deadly anti semitic attack in american history many neighborhoods would be understandably subsumed by despair and recrimination after such an event but not this one mark oppenheimer poignantly shifts the focus away from the criminal and his crime and instead presents the historic spirited community at the center of this heartbreak he speaks with residents and nonresidents jews and gentiles survivors and witnesses teenagers and seniors activists and historians together these stories provide a kaleidoscopic and nuanced account of collective grief love support and revival but oppenheimer also details the difficult dialogue and messy confrontations that squirrel hill had to face in the process of healing and that are a necessary part of true growth and understanding in any community he has reverently captured the vibrancy and caring that still characterize squirrel hill and it occasioned by a crisis in his company s fortunes dodging an iago like rival he finds love with a colleague in his department endangers his bond with his family and finally confronts the single urgent question of his life the adventurer is about relationships henry has complicated ones with his sister gretchen who has stayed at home with their father his lover jane a sleek and efficient mirror image of henry and a tantalizing potential girlfriend madison the ultimate free spirit but his relationship to the responsibilities in that anonymous office park may change his fortunes even more than the women in his life a comedy on a 14 year old boy who still sucks his thumb cured of the habit by his dentist he finds himself deprived of a relaxant and the novel describes his search for a cobb the king kong of oral obsessives as his dentist dubs him and the most appealingly bright and screwed up fictional adolescent since holden caulfield donned his hunter s cap for years no remedy not orthodontia not the escalating threats of his father mike a washed out linebacker turned sporting goods entrepreneur not the noxious cayenne pepper based suk no mor can cure justin s thumbsucking habit then a course of hypnosis seemingly does the trick but true to the conservation of neurotic energy the problem doesn t so much disappear as relocate sex substance abuse speech team fly fishing honest work even mormonism justin throws himself into each pursuit with a hyperactive energy that even his daily ritalin dose does little to blunt each time however he discovers that there is no escaping the unruly imperatives of his self and the confines of his deeply eccentric family the only cure for the adolescent condition is time and distance always funny sometimes hilariously so occasionally poignant and even disturbing deeply wise on the vexed subject of fathers and sons walter kirn s thumbsucker is an utterly fresh and all american take on the painful process of growing up little failure is an autobiography of comic genius by the hilarious gary shteyngart little failure its title the same as the alarming pet name given to the young gary shteyngart by his father when growing up in pre glasnost russia is one of the most remarkable immigrant memoirs ever written a candid and deeply poignant story of a soviet family s trials and tribulations and of their escape in 1979 to the consumerist promised land of the usa it is also an exceptionally funny account of the author s transformation from asthmatic toddler in red square to 40 something manhattanite with a is a delight aravid adiga gary shteyngart was born in leningrad in 1972 in 2007 he was named one of granta s best young american novelists his debut the russian debutante s handbook was widely acclaimed and won the national jewish book award for fiction as were his second absurdistan one of the 10 best books of the year in the new york times and super sad true love story he writes regularly for the new yorker as cotkin shows not only did americans readily take to existentialism but they were already heirs to a rich tradition of thinkers from jonathan edwards and herman melville to emily dickinson and william james who had wrestled with the problems of existence and the contingency of the world long before sartre and his colleagues after introducing the concept of an american existential tradition cotkin examines how formal existentialism first arrived in america in the 1930s through discussion of kierkegaard and the early vogue among new york intellectuals for the works of sartre beauvoir and camus a triumph of the imagination rich in incident and beautiful in its detail cloudsplitter brings to life one of history s legendary figures john brown whose passion to
